
Sunday School Lessons Unit Three "The Birthing of A New Community" February 2017

Many people reduce their religious obligations to fulfilling a set of legalistic requirements. What are the characteristics of an authentic Christian lifestyle? Paul sharply contrasts a Spirit-filled life with life in the flesh.

Goal for the Learners

- ✓ To define characteristics Paul lists as fruit of the Spirit.
- To sense the needs of others in the church.
- ✓ To work, by the Spirit's empowerment, "for the good of all, especially for those of the family of faith."

Lesson Challenges for the Week

- Review today's key verses, Galatians 5:22-23. Identify the specific fruit that you feel is mature within you. Then identify another fruit that is not "ripe." What steps can you take to nurture this particular fruit?
- Help someone who is struggling with a
 heavy load to bear this burden. Is there
 something you can do to help a family dealing with serious illness, or a major loss, or
 a serious financial reversal? If so, do
 whatever you can in the name of Jesus.
- Do something to show your Bible study teacher that you appreciate all that he or she does for the class. A note, small gift, or invitation to a meal would mean a great deal to your teacher, especially if he or she is a volunteer.
